## Idaho LAUNCH Basics

### Launch is for:

- Idaho Resident(s)
- Planning to use the benefit to work in Idaho for at least one year after their training ends

### There is a benefit for anyone who meets above requirements:

- 80% approved tuition and fees only

### Important Details

- \$3,500 once in a lifetime max benefit
- Program can include more than one course (Example: Years 1 and 2 of an Apprenticeship)
- Idaho LAUNCH agreement must be signed prior to course start.
- Idaho LAUNCH recipients must begin their course within 6 (six) months of contract signing
