UT	Utah Nursing Assistant Registry (UNAR)	No	Most of our funding comes from a grant through the Utah Department of Health. We also provide for the testing of CNAs to become certified and so collect testing fee's, some of which help offset the funding issue since DOH only provides about 60% of our cost. We also collect fees for reciprocity, name changes, that sort of thing. CNAs are charged a fee if they renew late.	No	Respondent works for UNAR. The DOH contracts with Davis Technical College to run the registry. Our responsibilities include CNA training program oversight, test management and administration, and the registry which includes renewal and reciprocity as well as initial certification. Much of this is made simpler by the software program we use, TMU from Headmaster LLC. They create a product that is adaptable to each state's individual needs.
WA	Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS)	No	The Registry is totally separate from the licensing/credentialing unit. DSHS is the regulatory part of the government, regulating long term care facilities (Nursing facilities/homes, Adult Family Homes, Assisted Living, etc.) The registry is under the NATCEP program and NATCEP is part of the operating budget.	No, they only track CNAs	Respondent works for Washington State Department of Social and Health Services. There is no fee to be put on the registry. According to the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Title 42 Chapter IV Subchapter D §483.156(a)(4): The state may not impose any charges related to the registration on individuals listed in the registry.
