







Open Rural Counties meet none of the above criteria.




Population Growth in Idaho Net Growth Percentage by County Type






The Aging of Rural Idaho

Population Growth, 2005 - 2015






The Aging of Rural Idaho Population Pyramids






The Aging of Rural Idaho Population Pyramids





Variance in Housing Stock Percentage of Households that Rent








Pricing Out Renters


Percentage of Households that are rent-burdened

Percentage Change from Pre-Recession Highs



Total Covered Employment


Percentage Change from 2000
