- Idaho is being highlighted in case studies.
- Hosting Women in Trades Webinar next week on the 16th
- The national website is showing 25 upcoming events and 6 proclamation signings, and 15 other informational events.
- Grant closes Feb 29th currently wrapping up initial reply.
- Served 3400 apprentices through program, 1040 finished.

National Youth Apprenticeship Summit Debrief

- CareerWise presentation
 - Founded in Colorado to address both the skilled-worker shortage and the unrealistic expectation that our nation's schools must prepare students for today's in-demand jobs without the involvement of industry.

- Adult Launch
 - Very popular, an additional \$2M dollars have been added.
 - WDTF fund proposal is in front of the Council.
 - 60% of funding to Launch, 40% to remaining programs.
 - o Currently holding on adding any additional courses until some gap analysis is completed.
- Student
 - Very busy
 - o Lots of chatter and presentations especially in rural areas
 - The Governor and Lt. Governor are also traveling around the state on behalf of the Launch program.
 - Presentations are ongoing to schools, employers for parents, and community groups.
 - JFAC must make the allocation for funding.
