## Idaho LAUNCH Updates

• Idaho LAUNCH Adults

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- \$5.4M ARPA funding initially
- \$2M added from WDTF
- Discussions and adjustments w/ Micron added an additional \$3.5M
- Anticipating we may have to turn off Adult Launch in March
- Unemployment insurance revenue amount unknown currently
  - Possibly \$4.5M
  - HB425 is with the legislature now which may change the percentage
    - Bill would decrease the tax amount
    - Funds to WDTF would be less
    - FY23 grant totaled \$11.4M before we had to close it.
- Would need a transfer of about \$800K to get the program to the end of April
- Idaho LAUNCH Students
  - February 1<sup>st</sup> data:
    - Round 2 contingent letters will go out March 15 31.
    - Currently at 13,037 applications

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- 12,266 actual submits, 763 started but not submitted.
- Higher rate of females
- Reg 3 highest number of applications
- Every district has at least 200 applicants, district 4 is at 177.
- Trends
  - Healthcare is the number one choice with Nursing at number two.

#### **GAP Analysis Data**

- Data collection for Adult Launch is not a clean process.
  - Driven by the participant.
  - Clean-up of data is time consuming, but in process.
  - New grant management system will function with both programs.
  - Low incomplete rate overall, 7%
- CTE capacity project update
  - Next step is to ensure the coding is correct.
  - Institutions have been asked for their capacity levels.
  - o Currently identifying programs that can have sections added versus those that have restraints.
  - Programs are getting creative to ensure they meet capacity requirements.
  - Highest demand ties to some of the least capacity programs
