Sherawn Reberry

- Funding full amount \$70M, 9200 awards
- Changes
 - o Definition of in-demand careers, allows WDC to utilize additional factors
 - Adjusted list in August or September prior to opening applications for next year
 - o Financial need added to statute to work with tax commission if prioritization is needed
 - Clarification on award date from June 1 to June 30 and report to legislature date to September 30
 - o Implementation Framework updates
- Stats through round 2
 - o 7308 contingent offers made, 7167 accepted, 181 declined, 478 extension requests
 - 5 reasons for extension; volunteer, medical, waitlist, military, and religious
 - o Top programs
 - Haven't changed
 - Nursing top, business second
 - Top providers

- Goal is to gain employment when they exit the institution and be successful
- Winning awards bolsters reputation and gives drive
- Lt Steve Selzer presentation
 - April 2020 pandemic hits and presents challenges
 - Looking for ways to navigate, started to build new tools to sanitize
 - New equipment with no knowledge of how to use
 - Explained need to Mario, he started building videos which went out state-wide
 - He created a studio in his cell, it takes fortitude and integrity to do this
 - Builds videos, American legion became a huge supporter
 - Idaho Commanding General traveled in under quarantine to recognize their contributions
 - Mario moved to SICI, received small grant, built another small studio and started a PR campaign
