**Unanimous consent motion by Lt. Governor Bedke to approve the January 9, 2025 Meeting Minutes. No objections. Motion carried.**

**STEM AC Integration**

**Wendi Secrist & Dee Mooney**

- STEM AC started in 2015
- Created to bring industry and education together
- Overall intents of STEM AC and WDC align
- Perfect time to merge, Governor Little moved STEM AC under direction of WDC in August of 2024
- Integration should not be a “bolt-on” but rather a growth opportunity for new ideas and rethinking of roles and responsibilities
- The current plan is to structure the work in 3 bureaus
  - Strategy and Operations
  - Education and Career
  - Employer
- Some positions will not go forward in new structure, conversations held this week with those affected; 3 at STEM AC and 1 at WDC effective July 1
- 1 position of the 3 at STEM AC is not currently filled
- STEM AC current has 8 positions, 5 will integrate, the other 3 may be used to bring EcosySTEM regional coordinators in-house

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- Individuals affected are being supported with locating new roles
- Teams will operate as one unit with two budgets during FY26
- One budget in FY27 under WDC
- Some programs under STEM AC may be better suited under different organizations
- STEM is still very important, talking point should not be that it is going away, but evolving
- Working on FAQs and talking points
- Questions:
  - Major donors Micron & INL – they are engaged in conversations
  - STEM AC Foundation working on communication, and their direction moving forward
  - STEM AC & WDC budgets are going through JFAC
  - EcosySTEM
    - Collection of people, community organizations and businesses from all regions engaging in STEM activities
    - Hub coordinators are in communities doing the coordination
    - IBE currently acts as “host” for employees
    - Should the Foundation be a stand alone – and take over from IBE?
    - Idaho Business for Education has much larger mission, EcosySTEM is just one program
  - It appears there are new items that haven’t been in our wheelhouse
    - Felt there was synergy and that we could bring them together with the additional scope of work
    - The directive of the Governor was to go figure out a path forward
    - Education and Careers bureau should bring new and different things forward
    - Some things may better fit elsewhere – still working on those transitions
  - WDC and LAUNCH are under huge fire, does this add to the fire?
    - Ready to talk about efficiencies, synergies
    - Good if we can explain how dollars are going to go farther by capturing natural efficiencies
  - We are very protective of LAUNCH
    - Be ready to talk about it
    - Best thing we have done
  - Organization chart
    - Ms. Mooney came in to manage STEM AC
      - In FY26 her position will be managing the bulk of the operational integration
      - Deliberate, working through FY26 to finalize integrated budget
    - What about WD training grants
      - It will transition over from Matt to grant team
      - Amanda will take over development through close-out
  - We care and are concerned about going forward with this
    - Lt. Governor Bedke will share concerns with Governor’s office

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- Merging isn't the problem, going to make WD more current, integrates STEM, it is one of the coats tails the governor wants to elevate
- Be ready to speak about this as needed

### **Executive Director Report**

**Wendi Secrist**

- Launch update
  - Public school numbers only, private in process
    - 32% immediate fall go on rate – 13% increase
    - 5.6% increase in resident enrollment
    - 23% of those that went on had lower than 2.7 GPA, the cut off for opportunity scholarship
  - Getting private school data will shine a light on the program and show accountability
  - Stanford Hoover Institute is doing a research project on LAUNCH, they are funding it
    - They want the whole picture
    - Independent research
  - Be mindful, incremental increases are good, making sure vulnerable populations are going on

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- Expectation is not that the percentage will continue to go up year over year
