- Partial funding through federal grants (\$6M)
- October 2024 began with partnerships
- Report:
 - Long overdue, we had a need to share information out with everyone
 - Meet monthly
 - Report initially published early April 2025
 - Will soon be available on the WDC website
 - Chair, Matthew Thomsen; will change year by year
 - Strategic plan recently created
 - \$13M invested since 2016
 - \$23 per hour average wage of participant upon completion
 - 3 yrs average length of an apprenticeship
 - 273 sponsors in Idaho

 - We should be attending other community groups with these presentations, Rotary, Kiwanis, Lions
 - Is the goal LAUNCH or career pathways, Both
 - Get the word out about LAUNCH and apprenticeships, as well as other opportunities
 - Basic communication that there are funds available
- Counselors and kids say not everyone knows about LAUNCH, we do need to do more
- Thank you letters from students to legislature are still being discussed by counselors
- Main counselor connection is with public schools
- Lots of turnover rate with college and career counselors, academic counselors tend to stay
- Where are the targeted gaps? A specific part of the state or industries lacking interest
- Sherawn has reached out to all counselors and created information in Basecamp software that can be utilized by them
- In-service days are a great opportunity along with Waypoint
- Go-on is up 15% overall this year (public only)
