- Numbers
  - Ahead of last year's progress
  - o Funded 5,151
  - o Extensions 205
  - Graduation verification needed for 924
  - o Declined 125
  - Waitlist of 528 additional offers made, 400 were on Opportunity Scholarship's waitlist and were not going to be offered
  - Accepted, but something still to do outside of graduation verification 631
- Institutions are assisting
- Have until Dec 31<sup>st</sup> per statute to enroll in a program

### In-Demand List for Class of 2026

Dr. Reberry

- Information provided: 2026 list, 2025 list, occupations lost for 2026, occupations gained for 2026
- Total occupations this year 525, last year 487
- Questions
  - Can we tell if Idaho LAUNCH was a contributor to the changes for occupations lost, i.e. are LAUNCH participants filling the need?

  - Create a document showing providers and programs for 2026
- o To be provided at the September Council meeting for review, no action needed
- O How do occupations get back on the list?
  - List is data-driven, based on 5 items and their ranking for each
    - Projected Annual Openings
    - Average Annual Openings
    - Wage Potential
    - Location Quotient
    - BGI Data
  - A ranking of 3 is the threshold
  - Other context for a lost occupation
    - Results are data driven solely
      - Our process is as objective as we can make it
  - If there is a better approach the committee is open to changes
  - Occupations on the cusp of the threshold
    - Would we consider averaging as some occupations seem to be some out falling on and then back on year to year
    - Possible now with year 3 beginning discussion topic for future meeting
  - How did occupations go from a 4 ranking to 0?
