

Registered Apprenticeship Incentive



The Registered Apprenticeship Incentive is designed to offset the extraordinary costs of utilizing a Registered Apprenticeship training program. Applications are reviewed quarterly by the WDC Grant Review Committee.

Funding

- Up to \$1,000 per apprentice per year for the duration of the apprenticeship
- Maximum \$10,000 per employer per year
- Grant period aligned to the length of the apprenticeship program
- Funds distributed after apprentice completes 500 hours of on-the-job training (175 hours for Youth Apprenticeship)



Covered Training Costs

- Vendor-provided training (instructor wages, travel, materials)
- Structured internal training (instructor wages, travel, materials)

Not Covered

- Employee onboarding
- Wages paid to individuals during training
- Temporary, seasonal, and contract-only positions

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- Be registered with the Idaho Secretary of State and in good standing
- Provide a health benefit plan to employees
- Pay at least \$12 per hour entry level wage (preference for jobs at or above county average wage)
- Use a US Department of Labor Registered Apprenticeship program
- Provide evidence of apprentice's registration

Performance Metrics

- Number of employees trained
- Wage gains after one year
- Employee retention
