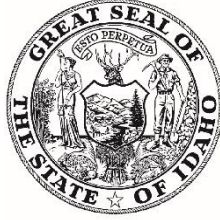

- 3 phases
- 10 finalists
- Collaboration across state agencies
- Submitted from Governor's office
- CTE would act as financial agent
- Gives Idahoans a clear way to show what they can do
- Simplistic: job board
- Integrates AI
- Idea is that everything is inter-operable
- Due date for first submission is April 30th
- Next meeting April 2nd
- Example in links from Alabama "Talent Triad"
- Idaho has been working in this space, good candidate

- Build from shared values across agencies
- Begin thinking about measurements
- Present to Council in June
- Survey results

- What do we want to focus on
 - ROI is tricky, involved in all, should be a part of each
 - If not, a positive ROI shouldn't be doing it

- Learner view CTE– grouped, kept ROI separate
 - ROI could have metrics from each – Labor, Learner, Social, ROI Buckets
 - As it is in the state



- - Who gets the value of the wage, can affect multiple
 - Outcomes are the ROI
 - What are we defining ROI as
 - Need measure of the cost
 - Similar to what is being done with gainful employment
 - Mixing things with complex definitions with outcome measures
 - Social, public value may not have the high wage affecting positive ROI
 - In-demand careers, do you consider if the participants ROI is low
 - Currently we don't take social impact but look at demand
 - Have metrics to offset
- Change categories
 - Return on investment to self, employer, state
 - Return is going to be non-monetary as well
 - Credential is any type
 - Can work toward 3 types of ROI
 - Being asked to work on ROI for the state first
 - Which domains key into this, start here
 - Wages fit into multiple and may be subset and not stand alone
 - May lead down the path to build out the others
 - This group is driving the initiative
 - Being pressed to develop how to measure for COV
- This work will assist work being done in other groups like OSBE
- Focus on “state”
 - ROI should focus on all three eventually
 - Focus on what is measurable now
 - Re-educate legislators that there is more to it going forward
 - Now focus is “are we getting our money back”, should we be investing in this
- Re-categorize domains, wage is directly tied to the skills
- Success unknown first 2 years, should heavily subsidize, information is lacking, resiliency is missing in some
 - What can we do to help them with early courses to be successful
 - Institutions have some responsibilities
- New Categorization, next meeting we will discuss how to measure
